In order to strengthen cooperation with partner academies abroad, the Austrian Academy of Sciences (OeAW) organizes regular “Joint Academy Days”.

Within the framework of this event series, representatives of the OeAW discuss scientific and science policy issues with members of their partner academies.

The European Academies Science Advisory Council (EASAC) is a network of national science academies of member states of the European Union as well as Norway, Switzerland and the United Kingdom that has existed since 2001. EASAC prepares statements, reports and popular science writings on current socially relevant topics in the fields of energy, the environment and health, in particular for the institutions of the EU.

With the location of the EASAC Office at the Austrian Academy of Sciences from 2024 (at least until 2026), the OeAW will strengthen the critical voice of European scientists in supporting evidence-informed policymaking.

The Joint Academy Day thus also serves as an unofficial kick-off to this new collaboration.

The event is dedicated to the subject of “Sustainable Energy Solutions” and will open with a keynote lecture by the President of EASAC, Wim van Saarloos.

An exciting round of discussions is to be expected, as experts from both institutions will participate in a panel on the highly relevant topic of “Energy Transition: Realistic Ambitions and Ambitious Perspectives”.
